National Statistics (rounded)

400,000 are in out of home care*

200,000 will enter care

200,000 will remain in care

<u>200,000</u> will exit care

100,000 reunification

50,000 adopted

20,000 exit to a guardian

30,000 emancipation (age out)

* Out of home care (OHC): Kinship, foster families, group homes, emergency shelters, rehabilitation facilities, and others.

Compare this to:

Population of Tulsa 411,000



Oklahoma Statistics (rounded)

7,500 are in out of home care

6,250 children 12 and under

1,250 youths 13 and over

4,000 will exit care

2,000 reunification

1,400 adopted

300 exit to a guardian

200 emancipation (age out)*

100 other

* Compare this to:

780 Churches in Tulsa

7,200 Churches in all of Oklahoma
